



The Snowbasin Ski Team will host an Alpine Officials Clinic on Sunday November 11, 2018. US Ski and Snowboard AOs who are certified as Technical Delegate, Referee, Jury Advisor, Chief of Race, and Chief of Course, Timing & Calculations & Race Administrators are required to attend a Continuing Education Clinic every two years.

Aspiring Alpine Officials are encouraged begin the certification process starting with the Course Official Introduction. The Course Official (CO) is now available online at <https://www.imdalpine.org/alpine101/> So in the interest of time please use the online study packet and complete the test for CO. We will not offer this course at the fall clinic at Snowbasin.

US Ski and Snowboard has produced and approved an online Competition Official course and test. Competition Official is a required course that must be completed before attending training sessions and testing for any of the other Alpine Official categories (TD, Referee, Chief of Race, Jury Advisor, Race Administrator).

To complete the online Competition Official course, save the pdf file to your computer, carefully read through the training material and complete the test at the end of the packet.

Copies of the 2018-19 USSA/FIS Review & Update and 18-19 FIS Precisions will be available.
